## 2.1 Admission Requirements

2.1.1 Applicants should have at least 5 “O” level passes including English Language and (Mathematics were applicable) and should meet at least one of the following requirements relevant to the programme applied for;

- a. Possess academic qualifications obtained from a University or institution of similar status acceptable to Senate.
- b. Possess a Certificate/Diploma in Education of the University at an Associate College of the University or any diploma qualification at National or Higher National level.
- c. Possess a degree of this University or another discipline considered relevant.
- d. For admission to the Bachelor of Social Work (Honours) programme, applicants must have satisfactorily completed the Diploma in Social Work.

**NB. Holders of foreign (pre-university) qualifications should apply through special entry unless they possess A Levels.**

2.1.2 Applicants must give careful thought to their choice of programmes/subjects as selection will be on merit and ***applicants will be limited to one preference only.***
