the National Championships for Delta Ethics and Transparency Initiative. In 2014 he led ENACTUS University of Zimbabwe to victory at the ENACTUS national Championships on social entrepreneurship and went on to represent University of Zimbabwe and the country at large at the ENACTUS World Championships in Beijing, China. In 2015 he received the Vice Chancellor's Ambassador Award - the highest accolade given to UZ's most outstanding student in community service and leadership in each year. In the same year he also received 5 other accolades including Spirit of Voluntary Service Award, Effective Communication Award and Best Peer Counsellor of the Year Award. In addition, he launched two Toastmasters Gavel Clubs for the University Main Campus and the UZ's College of Health Sciences Campus in the interest of enhancing students' ability to communicate effectively. In 2016 Simbarashe represented Zimbabwe at the

Yenching Global Symposium on China's relations with the rest of the world. His achievements, work ethic and sense of discipline enable him to serve as an effective mentor to University students. He is also a source of critical networks for the success of the University's Department of Social Work initiatives like the Sustainable Development Series.
